Prior Authorization Policy

Products Affected:

- **Reblozyl (luspatercept-aamt)**

The Plan may authorize coverage of the above products for members meeting the following criteria:

Covered Use	All FDA approved indications not otherwise excluded
Required Medical Information	Documentation of all the following: 1. Diagnosis of beta thalassemia; AND a. The member requires regular blood cell transfusions defined as a minimum of 6 red blood cell units in the most recent 24 weeks; AND

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	<p>b. The member has not had a transfusion-free period for ≥ 35 days during the most recent 24 weeks; OR</p> <p>2. Diagnosis of anemia with Myelodysplastic Syndromes with Ring Sideroblasts or Myelodysplastic/Myeloproliferative Neoplasm with Ring Sideroblasts and thrombocytosis; AND</p> <p>a. Member has tried and failed or had an inadequate response or contraindication to an erythropoiesis stimulating agent (ESA); AND</p> <p>b. The member requires 2 or more RBC units over an 8 week period</p>
Age Restriction	18 years of age and older
Prescriber Restriction	Prescribed by or in consultation with a hematologist.
Coverage Duration	Initial: 6 months Reauthorization: 12 months
Other criteria	<p>Reauthorization:</p> <p>1. Documentation of a positive clinical response to therapy demonstrated by a reduction in transfusion requirements from pretreatment baseline of at least 2 units packed red blood cells while receiving Reblozyl.</p>
