## Prior Authorization Policy

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### Products Affected:

- **Cresemba capsule and injection**
- **itraconazole capsule and solution**
- **Jublia 10% solution**
- **Luliconazole 1% cream**
- **Luzu 1% cream**
- **Noxafil suspension and injection**
- **posaconazole tablet and suspension**
- **voriconazole tablet and suspension**

The Plan may authorize coverage of the above products for members meeting the following criteria:

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<b>Covered Use</b>	All FDA approved indications not otherwise excluded
<b>Required Medical Information</b>	<p><b>itraconazole capsule and solution:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Laboratory findings (KOH preparation, fungal culture, or nail biopsy) that confirm the diagnosis of onychomycosis within the previous 6 months; <b>AND</b></li> <li>2. Evidence of medically significant onychomycosis due to any of the following conditions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paronychia (involvement of the skin around the border of the nail).</li> <li>• Medically significant pain caused by the affected nail/s.</li> <li>• Immunodeficiency due to disease or immunosuppressant drug therapy</li> <li>• Diabetes mellitus with additional risk factors for cellulitis (i.e. prior cellulitis , venous insufficiency, edema)</li> <li>• History of cellulitis of the lower extremity with infection of the ipsilateral toenail; <b>AND</b></li> </ul> </li> <li>3. An inadequate response, intolerance or contraindication to a full course of oral terbinafine; <b>OR</b></li> <li>4. A diagnosis of tinea infection not responding to a trial of topical antifungal therapy and oral terbinafine; <b>OR</b></li> <li>5. A diagnosis of a serious/invasive systemic fungal infection requiring systemic antifungal therapy</li> </ol> <p><b>Noxafil suspension and injection, posaconazole tablet and suspension</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. A diagnosis of Oropharyngeal candidiasis (for suspension only); <b>AND</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ An inadequate response, intolerance, resistance or contraindication to fluconazole and itraconazole; <b>OR</b></li> </ul> </li> <li>2. A requirement of prophylaxis for invasive aspergillus or candida infections; <b>AND</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Severe immunodeficiency such as hematopoietic stem cell transplant with graft vs host disease, high risk solid organ transplant recipient, or prolonged neutropenia secondary to chemotherapy; <b>OR</b></li> </ul> </li> <li>3. A diagnosis of a zygomycosis infection; <b>OR</b></li> <li>4. A diagnosis of a posiconazole sensitive invasive fungal infection with documented resistance to other oral antifungal therapy (culture studies must be included); <b>AND</b></li> <li>5. Clinical rationale why the injectable formulation is preferred over the oral formulations (for injection only)</li> </ol>

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voriconazole tablet and suspension:

1. A diagnosis of invasive aspergillus, Fusarium spp or Scedosporium apiospermum infections ; **AND**
  - An inadequate response, intolerance or contraindication to an alternative antifungal therapy appropriate for the fungal infection ; **OR**
2. A diagnosis of candidemia, or esophageal candidiasis; **AND**
  - An inadequate response, intolerance, resistance or contraindication to fluconazole and itraconazole.

**Cresemba capsule and injection:**

1. A diagnosis of invasive mucormycosis (zygomycosis) confirmed by fungal culture; **OR**
2. A diagnosis of invasive aspergillus; **AND**
  - An inadequate response, intolerance, resistance, or contraindication to voriconazole; **AND**
3. A clinical rationale for use of the injectable formulation over the oral formulation(injection only)

**Jublia 10% Solution:**

1. Laboratory findings (KOH preparation, fungal culture, or nail biopsy) that confirm the diagnosis of onychomycosis of the toenail(s) due to Trichophyton rubrum and Trichophyton mentagrophytes within the previous 6 months; **AND**
2. Evidence of medically significant onychomycosis due to any of the following conditions:
  - a. Paronychia (involvement of the skin around the border of the nail).
  - b. Medically significant pain caused by the affected nail/s.
  - c. Immunodeficiency due to disease or immunosuppressant drug therapy
  - d. Diabetes mellitus with additional risk factors for cellulitis (i.e. prior cellulitis , venous insufficiency, edema)
  - e. History of cellulitis of the lower extremity with infection of the ipsilateral toenail; **AND**
3. Inadequate response, contraindication, or intolerance to two of the following antifungal agents:
  - a. Minimum of 12 week treatment with oral terbinafine.
  - b. Minimum of 12 week treatment with itraconazole [PA required]
  - c. Minimum of 12 week treatment with ciclopirox [PA required]

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	<p><b>luliconazole and Luzu 1% cream:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Diagnosis of interdigital tinea pedis, tinea cruris, or tinea corporis caused by <i>Trichophyton rubrum</i> and <i>Epidermophyton floccosum</i> that is confirmed by a positive KOH stain, positive PAS stain, or a positive fungal culture, and member is experiencing pain that limits normal activity. <b>AND</b></li> <li>2. Inadequate response, contraindication, or intolerance to both of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Topical treatment with 2 of the following: terbinafine 1% cream, ciclopirox 0.77% cream or tolfanate 1% cream <b>AND</b></li> <li>○ Oral treatment with oral terbinafine. <b>AND</b></li> </ul> </li> <li>3. For Luzu 1% cream a trial failure of generic luliconazole 1% cream.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Age Restriction</b></p>	<p>Noxafil suspension and posaconazole tablet: 13 years and older  Noxafil injection: 18 years or older  Cresemba: 18 years or older  Luzu and luliconazole: 18 years and older</p>
<p><b>Coverage Duration</b></p>	<p>Initial:  Itraconazole 100mg capsule , solution and terbinafine tablets:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Onychomycosis: Maximum of 6 weeks for fingernail infection or 12 weeks for toenail infection. Only one course of therapy will be approved over a period of one year from the approval date.</li> <li>• Tinea infection: Maximum of 2 weeks</li> <li>• Other systemic infections: up to recommended treatment durations specific to type of infection</li> </ul> <p>Noxafil (posaconazole):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Prophylaxis therapy: maximum of 1 year</li> <li>• Treatment: up to recommended treatment durations specific to type of infection</li> </ul> <p>voriconazole:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Treatment: up to recommended treatment durations specific to type of infection</li> </ul> <p>Cresemba capsule and injection</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Initial : 12 weeks</li> </ul>
